National Lottery Community Fund is reaching out to grantees, partners, and other vital civil society organisations to understand how it can support communities and the sector during Covid-19. The Fund aims to share what it learns over the coming period.

The Indigo Trust: The Indigo Trust is making £2.5m available through emergency grants to help charities respond to the coronavirus emergency.

Standard Life Foundation <u>has launched funding</u> for work directly related to the coronavirus pandemic.

Grants will be made to organisations which tackle financial problems and improve living standards for those on low-to-middle incomes in the UK. It is likely that grants will be made in the range of £5,000 to £50,000, however, there is no set amount that people can apply for.

Charities Aid Foundation has launched an emergency fund offering one-off grants of up to £10,000 to small charities and social enterprises that are struggling during the current crisis. Organisations with a turnover up to £1m can apply.

National Lottery Awards For All have devoted all their immediate resources over the next 6 months to projects addressing the immediate effects of Covid-19. read more here. You can apply for up to £10,000 (even if you've already got another Awards For All grant currently live).

The Ballinger Charitable Trust has paused its normal application process and opened it instead to groups "actively responding to help the North East community they serve through the impacts of covid-19" specifically "older people, hospital discharges, support around domestic abuse and food and fuel support to communities in financially disadvantaged areas". Small amounts up to £1000 can be applied for via a very quick and simplified application process see their website for criteria and further details – https://www.ballingercharitabletrust.org.uk/

Karbon Homes Community Fund have also opened a community fund you can apply to for small covid-support related projects up to £5000 in areas (much of North Tyneside) where they have Karbon homes – https://www.karbonhomes.co.uk/your-community/community-funding/

BBC Children in Need Emergency Essentials Programme

The BBC Children in Need Emergency Essentials Programme which supports children and young people up to the age of 18 living with severe poverty as well as additional pressures such as domestic violence, disability or poor health in the family is currently open for applications from referral organisations that will be able to apply for grants on behalf of families or young people.

The fund will **cover the purchase of critical items** such as essential household items, furniture and kitchen equipment, baby equipment and clothing in exceptional or emergency situations. Applications must be completed by a registered referrer who is part of an organisation that is supporting the family or young person and capable of assessing their needs. The referrer's organisation should also be able to administer and supervise the grant on behalf of the BBC Children in Need Emergency Essentials Programme.
