I volunteer as a Chaplain at my local Air Cadet Squadron and we held a virtual 1945 themed talent night and a quiz. Our young people were imaginative as they showcased juggling, playing instruments, dog training, magic and the like, finding new ways of being

'normal'. Finding the 'new normal' is something we, as churches and churches together, are going to have to think about as we move from the current lockdown to living with Covid 19, thinking what church might look like as we move forward and learning from the ways in which we have adapted over the last few months. I think it will be even more critical that we do that together.
